Summary of Christopher Hubbart's Criminal, Social and Legal History

January 22, 1951 -- born Pasadena, California

1951-1957 – Hubbart lived in Pasadena with two sisters

1957-1969 -- Family moved to Claremont; Hubbart graduated Claremont High

1969-1972 Hubbart lived in LA County with his Mother and Stepfather

1968-69 -- Uncharged rapes and sexual assault of Jane Does I and II (Hubbart admits)

1969-72 -- Hubbart admits to raping and molesting women at two week intervals over a 2 ½ year period; Hubbart never charged with these (approximately 50-70 uncharged unreported rapes)

5/1972-11/72 -- Hubbart committed numerous rapes (23 victims) and assaults (26 victims) in LA and San Bernardino Counties

11/7/72 -- Hubbart was arrested at his stepfather's furniture store after a citizen waiting in line to vote called police as Hubbart ran past the polling place, fleeing from sexually assaulting and attempting to burglarize his last LA victim

7/9/73 -- LA Grand Jury Indicts Hubbart on 21 Counts. Hubbart pled to one count of burglary, one count of rape, and three counts of sodomy and was committed to Atascadero State Hospital as a Mentally Disordered Sex Offender (MDSO) for nine years. Release date set as 10/30/81.

11/13/79 -- Hubbart was released from Atascadero State Hospital (ASH) on "Community Outpatient Status"

12/80 -- Hubbart raped his 24th Sexual Assault victim (reported) in San Francisco. He admits to it later but was never charged.

12/1980-11/1981 -- Hubbart commits rapes, sexual assaults (including forcible oral copulation, sodomy, rape with a foreign object, etc) in San Francisco, Sunnyvale and Santa Clara of more than 23 victims (2.3 victims per month). During this time, Hubbart was living in Sunnyvale and having consensual sex with two different girlfriends reportedly every night. Was attending AA meetings.

11/1981 -- Hubbart's probation revoked after he told his outpatient therapist he was "losing control" and he was returned to ASH at request of mental health criminal justice unit in San Jose

3/82 -- Hubbart arrested at ASH by Sunnyvale police for rape and forcible oral cop of a Sunnyvale victim

5/82 -- Outpatient status legally revoked

- 6/82 -- Hubbart charged and convicted of eight counts of residential burglary, six counts of false imprisonment, and two counts of rape (16 counts)
- 8/82 -- Hubbart sentenced to 16 years in state prison
- 4/12/90 -- Hubbart paroled in Santa Clara County after serving just 7 years 8 months
- 6/90 -- Less than two months after release Hubbart stalked and assaulted a victim he met on a bus in San Jose and was arrested for false imprisonment of another victim (Sexual assault Victim 38, Victim 50 and 51)
- 8/90 -- Hubbart sentenced to five years in State Prison for false imprisonment
- 1/25/93 -- Hubbart Paroled to Southern California (Claremont/Ontario)
- 3/16/93 -- Parole revoked after two months per Licensed Clinical Social Worker recommends return to custody for psych evaluation
- 4/94 2nd Psyc. Recommends return to custody; good cause found after hearing: Hubbart is a danger as a result of mental disease, Axis 1 Paraphilla NOS Severe; Paraphilia NOS Moderate (Klismaphilia); Paraphilia NOS Moderate (Frotteurism)
- 4/95 3rd Psych recommends return to custody, pursuant to hearing, good cause found. Dr. Bass made same diagnosis as in 4/84 and opined Hubbart will reoffend; Fleming opined Hubbart not a danger and d/n have a mental disorder; Faulkender opined Hubbart is a danger but d/n have a mental disorder
- 1/2/96 -- Hubbart brought to Santa Clara for SVP Proceedings after enactment of new SVP law and first SVP case in California
- 1/25/96 -- Hubbart paroled though in custody as an SVP (parole runs concurrently with commitment as an SVP)
- March 21, 2000 Jury found petition for SVP to be true. Hubbart committed as an SVP. Receives annual reviews under W & I 6605. All Doctors find him to be an SVP and a future risk to the community.
- Early 2013 -- Judge Brown entertains Hubbart's Motion for Conditional Release under W & I 6608 after reports he has completed treatment at Coalinga State Hospital (unbeknownst to LA County)
- April 19 and 26, 2013 -- Judge Brown holds hearing with Santa Clara County DA and PD, and grants Conditional Release (LA County DA not notified of this hearing)

May 3, 2013 -- Following Domicile Hearing, Judge Brown Finds Domicile to be LA County following contentious hearing, over LA County DA objection; La County DAI testifies, Exhibits and Evidence introduced by LA County DA's Office showing Hubbart's domicile is Santa Clara

May 10, 2013 -- Judgment and Order for Conditional Released to Los Angeles County filed by Judge Brown

July 2013 - District Attorney's Office files Writ appealing Judge Brown's ruling that LA County is Hubbart's Domicile

July 12, 2013 – Status Hearing in Santa Clara; Appearances by LA County DA and DAI, Santa Clara DDA and PD, and Liberty Conrep Rep Alan Stillman

July 16. 2013 - Writ is Summarily Denied by California Court of Appeal

July 25, 2013 – Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office Files Petition for Review in California Supreme Court appealing conditional release to Los Angeles County

July 26, 2013 - Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office Files Petition for Writ of Mandate in California Supreme Court appealing conditional release to Los Angeles County

July 28, 2013 –Housing Committee Meets regarding placement locations and terms and conditions of Hubbart's placement and release; Liberty Conrep Reps Alan Stillman, Rick Labelle, David Forester are present, along with County Counsel and DDA and DAI and law clerks

July 28, 2013 - Stay granted on Hubbart's Release by California Supreme Court

September 30, 2013 – Housing Committee Meets regarding placement locations and terms and conditions of Hubbart's placement and release

October 17, 2013 - District Attorney's Office receives notification from Liberty Conrep that of more than 500 housing locations reviewed, one landlord has agreed to rent to Mr. Hubbart in a Jessica's Law compliant location; Housing location to be reviewed at court hearing October 25, 2013 in Santa Clara Couty

October 25, 2013 - Status Hearing on Housing set in Santa Clara; if housing approved, Liberty Conrep anticipates release 2-3 weeks after early December hearing if community response reviewed and housing approved by Judge Brown
